

- >An 'interdisciplinary assemblage'
  - ➤ Intrinsically interdisciplinary or...
  - >Addressed to an interdisciplinary audience
  - Submissions accepted globally
- > Developmental mission
  - ➤ Support emerging & first-time authors
  - ➤ Operates in an 'academic altruistic' mode
  - > Also seeks to enhance authors' profiles
- >Acceptance rates
  - >2024: 76%, Overall: 57%

Make sure to use the *CORRECT* editor & journal name!

# Locating & Evaluating

- Finding 'right candidate journal' is important
  - > What you want to publish may determine choice
  - > Don't rely solely on 'metrics' as an evaluator
- ➤ Scholarship is social
  - Find your tribe reach out to authors/editors
  - Communities, societies, special interest groups
- Familiarise yourself with candidate journal
  - ➤ Read aims/scope/guidelines carefully
  - ➤ Read 2-3 articles do your 'values' align?

- Consider if the candidate journal:
  - Publishes your preferred article format?
  - ➤ Is read by your target audience?
  - Charges publishing fees, &/or is open access?
  - ➤ Is exclusive or generous in author rights?
- Beware of 'predatory' (trash) publishers
  - ➤ Think Check Submit guidelines
- > Follow guidance & requirements accurate
  - > Auto-rejection (structure, content, word-count)
  - → 'Prestige/high volume' journals reject more
  - >Article submitted with one title at a time



## Preparation & Audiences

- ➤ Careful preparation is key
  - > Don't rush to submit
  - Good enough...isn't good enough!
- ▶ Beware of overstuffing
  - ➤ One clear idea, well argued/explored
  - Common error of ECRs
  - ➤ Chapter /= Article /= Conference Paper
- >Seek critical friends as well as proofing
  - Read, re-read, re-edit, polish
  - ➤ Walk away & give yourself time/space

- ➤ Write with ALL your audiences in mind:
  - Your potential editor (first reader/gatekeeper)
  - Your reviewers (& harshest critics)
  - ➤ Your readership (the intended final audience!)
- Writing for interdisciplinary audiences
  - Clarity matters more for broad readership
  - Explain 'common' terminology &/or concepts
- Internationalise your text
  - Use idiomatic & colloquial terms/concepts sparingly



One editor can say is 'No' – but the next one might say 'Yes'!

## Introductions & Impressions

- ➤ Make a good first impression with your editor
  - Titles clearly, meaningfully, articulate themes
  - ➤ Abstract signpost readers through text
  - Consider SEO in keyword selection
  - ➤ Often used to evaluate suitability
- > Introduction also crucial
  - ➤ WHY your research matters?
  - >HOW it relates to the literature?
  - >WHAT is this paper going to achieve?

- The human touch can benefit your chances
  - > Approach editors BEFORE submission
  - Establish interest & chance of consideration
  - Cite (suitable) works in your candidate journal
  - > Demonstrate alignment with other pieces
- Submissions typically checked for:
  - ➤ Compliance: Style, word count, formatting requirements
  - >Scope: Closely matches publisher's interests?
  - Originality: Sufficiently original? Plagiarism?
  - ►Importance: Article significant enough?\*

\*Non-commercial publishers/journals worry far less about this!



Summarise 'harsh' feedback in your own words & use this when making revisions.

### Revisions & Decisions

- > Revisions requested most typical outcome
  - Embrace benefits to your writing don't fear them
  - Extensive feedback means reviewers feel it's worth developing
- >Address ALL reviewer/editorial comments
  - ➤ Walk away as needed and deal with 'dispassionately'
  - ➤ Meet editorial deadlines or risk rejection
  - ➤ Challenge aspects where needed

- Time & effort publishing Tier 1 journal
  - Smaller, 'lower' tier journals can be more accommodating
  - If in doubt take it elsewhere!
- >Other considerations
  - ➤ Clearance for third-party materials (other's IP)?
  - Satisfying publisher 'gold' open access charges\*
- ➤ Decline (rejection) is not always the end
  - ➤ Don't invest all your self-worth in your article
  - > Journals encourage/advise on resubmission
  - ➤ Check acceptance rates you aren't alone

\*Scholar-led diamond OA titles don't charge authors...



# Publication & Beyond

- **A.B.P.** 
  - > Always be promoting your content
  - > Exploit your socials
  - Drive readers to your articles
- Consider follow up publication
  - ➤ Self-citation...sparingly though
- ➤ Consider interdisciplinary publication
  - > Reach new audiences
  - Expand interest, contacts & collaborators

- > Publishing & editorial involvement
  - First to hear of new opportunities
  - > Deeper understanding of quality & timescales
- Creating your own journal
  - Lot of work but can make genuine impact
  - ➤ Showcase 'marginalised' topics
  - Or collaborate with established title?





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
